Community bus scheme

Kent County Council's Public Transport department had recently launched this year's community transport grant scheme. This is an opportunity for local charities, resident groups and parish or town councils, to apply for funding towards local schemes which provide invaluable services to residents who have difficulty accessing public transport. This year, an uplifted £450,000 is available for such schemes and groups can apply for funds for everything from the purchase of vehicles, to improvements for ICT equipment that helps in the running of schemes.
